

## Gavin W. Hougham, MA, PhD

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Sociologist, educator, and health care research industry executive Gavin W. Hougham, PhD, was recently Director of the Seattle regional division of Battelle Memorial Institute where he was responsible for strategic and operational leadership of a team of health care researchers, program evaluators, clinicians, social workers, nurses, and other scientists. Previously Assistant Professor of Medicine at the University of Chicago, Dr. Hougham was also Deputy Director of The Center for Health and the Social Sciences. Prior to that experience he was a foundation executive with the John A. Hartford Foundation in New York City, where he directed a \$60m dollar portfolio of strategic grantmaking in health care. He has led programs in the training and development of undergraduates, medical students, faculty and post-doctoral trainees, and has conducted health services, clinical, policy, and evaluation research in areas including aging, health outcomes, bioinformatics, health information technology, cross-cultural Japanese gerontology, social support, health workforce, research ethics, informed consent, and others.

With over 150 professional papers and presentations to date, Dr. Hougham's latest publications review the promise of advanced technologies and the risks of social isolation in the service of better population health: "Artificial Intelligence and its Potential to Improve Health of Older Adults," "Current Major Challenges in Aging and Targets for Technology," and "Risk of Social Isolation among Older Patients."

Hartford is a national philanthropy focused on helping prepare the nation to care for an aging population. I met with national leaders in academia, government, private philanthropy, and non-profit entities to develop innovative training and care delivery programs in medicine, nursing, and social work. Typical projects I designed or led included:

*Expanding the nation's output of medical school geriatrics faculty* through a national network of 28 Hartford Centers of Excellence in Geriatric Medicine and Training. I led and grew this program of grantmaking to U.S. medical schools to improve the national pipeline for the recruitment, training, and deployment of academic geriatricians.

*Expanding the pool and output of surgical and medical specialists, medical researchers, and medical students interested in aging-related fields.* I led this effort with the American Geriatrics Society, the Association of Directors of Geriatric Academic Programs, the Alliance for Academic Internal Medicine, the National Institute on Aging, the American Federation for Aging Research, the American Association of Medical Colleges, and others. I helped build networks of grants and training/research programs to help assure that all clinicians can properly care for older adults.

*Leading the Foundation's early work resulting in the publication of the Institute of Medicine's 2008 report, *Retooling for an Aging America*.* I led the Foundation's early collaborative effort with 10 other funding partners to commission a National Academy of Sciences expert review of what is needed to care for the country's growing older population. Many recommendations were subsequently included in the nation's Affordable Care Act legislation.

**Director of Research, *The University of Chicago, Department of Medicine, Section of Geriatrics (formerly part of the Section of General Internal Medicine)*, Chicago, IL. 1991-2005.** I designed and directed socio-medical, geriatrics, gerontological, and empirical ethics research. Trained and supervised research staff, medical students, postgraduate MD and PhD geriatrics and ethics fellows. Coordinated multi-center research; created and maintained complex statistical databases; analyzed survey and interview data using quantitative and qualitative methods; prepared talks, abstracts, grant proposals, and scientific papers for publication. Typical projects included:

*Potential Impact of NBAC's (National Bioethics Advisory Commission) Recommendations on Dementia Research.* I was Co-Investigator on this Alzheimer's Association funded study that included a structured review of a sample of published studies involving human subjects with dementia, a survey of the primary authors of these studies, a compilation of U.S. state laws on research with persons with dementia, a survey of state Attorneys General on regulatory oversight of dementia research.

*Dementia Research: Informed, Proxy and Advance Consent (DRIPAC).* I directed this NIH/NIA funded, multi-center, prospective collaborative study of the informed consent process in persons with dementia. The project brought a multi-disciplinary approach to developing new methods of cognitive capacity assessment, understanding how persons with dementia and members of their families make research enrollment decisions, testing the utility of a prospective research enrollment decision-making process similar to an "advance directive" for research, and assessing the stability of research enrollment decisions through the course of illness trajectories.

*Palliative Excellence in Alzheimer Care Efforts (PEACE)* Co-designed and directed the research components of the PEACE program, a Robert Wood Johnson Foundation funded, multi-center prospective study to develop and evaluate a palliative model of care for persons with Alzheimer Disease and other dementias. The study sought to "benchmark" the hallmarks and correlates of excellent clinical care of the community-dwelling patient with dementia.
